

Photosforclass.com is a great directory of Creative Commons images which when downloaded display the image's licensing attribution in the footer making them perfect for use in class as there is no risk of breaching copyright.

<u>To get started</u>

First go to <u>Photosforclass.com</u> and type in a keyword in the search box for any image you would like to include in a presentation or multimedia project. Tap Find Photos.

Having downloaded the image, you can see the attribution has been added to the footer giving details of how the image can be used.

To save the image on an iPad, hold your finger on the image until the Save Image option appears. Tap Save Image. Other directories of royalty free images include <u>Unsplash</u>, <u>Pexels</u> and <u>Pixabay</u>. You can also do an <u>advanced Google image search</u> and select 'Free to use share modify' before searching.
