- Can be used to work on all skills




## What and how?

## QR code bonanza!



#### **Advantages**

- Multi-skills
- Multiple use
- Very adaptable
- Good for creativity
- Good for differentiation
- Can be reused

#### **QR** maker

- Link to website URL
- Link to text
- Link to pictures
- Link to a video

#### Audio QR code

- Free website: QWIQR
- Need to create an account
- Print the code
- Scan the code
- Record
- Give the QR code to student, they scan and listen

#### **Practical ideas**

- Speaking
  - Type oral question in QR voice
  - Display around room, corridors, study areas...
  - Students scan in no particular order:
    - listen and answer on the spot
    - Listen and note the question
- Listening
  - Student must find what the question was
  - Student must listen for key information



- Developing an argument / making sentences
  - Using QR voice, record the different parts
  - Use walls of classroom to display
  - Students listen, piece it together and go and tell you / a partner (make many and have a story)
  - Get students to make the QR codes with their stories
  - Students listen to story and record the story
  - Play both and analyse the differences



#### Tell me a story

- Using either type of QR code
- Make up clues for story (weather; location; incident; verbs, time expressions...)
- Students go, scan, make a story and record it on voice recorder pro

#### Talking mini books

- Make QR voice of the vocabulary (print on one sheet)
- Also sheet of written version
- Match sound to written version, stick in mini books and draw illustration
- For revision, they make the recording and make their own books
- Oral book

## More creative writing



#### **Balloon stickers**

- A picture and a caption
- A great way to start with beginners
- Can be use as single items
- Can be used for more developed projects



#### **Texting story**

- Write a text message conversation
- Save it as a video or gif
- Students love it
- Great way to get from writing to acting it out

# Speaking



#### **PhotoSpeak**

- Animate the mouth and eyes of a photo or hand drawn picture of a face and save the results as a video
- Creative way of promoting speaking in the languages classroom

#### iFun Face

- Superimpose an animated mouth and eyes over a still image of a face or faces
- Record a video in the target language
- Good for more reluctant students

#### **My talking Avatar**

- Promoting speaking in the languages classroom
- Create an animated character
- Record up to 5 minutes as a video

#### **Flipboard**

- Saves articles
- Encourages students to read
- Helps students find content
- Develop students research skills

# Listening



#### **EdPuzzle**

- Independent work
- Can be set in advance
- Encourages students to plan learning
- Different types of questioning
- Class report

## What is a portfolio?


#### An opportunity for students to




