

## Food & Shopping

### Task: A Traditional Dish



### **Topic Overview**

This topic aims to prepare students to be able to buy food in a shop. Students will learn basic food vocabulary, typical food from the target language country/countries and simple expressions and phrases used to buy food. Students may take material from a wider pool of information provided.

### **Task Description**

Students write a shopping list to buy the necessary ingredients to prepare a chosen traditional Italian dish. Students have to keep their expenses to a given budget. Students can prepare a poster or PowerPoint presentation with images of their chosen dish and ingredients list.

### **Learning Outcomes**

- Understand and use numbers with help
- Recognise the main ingredients in a traditional dish
- Investigate prices of food items
