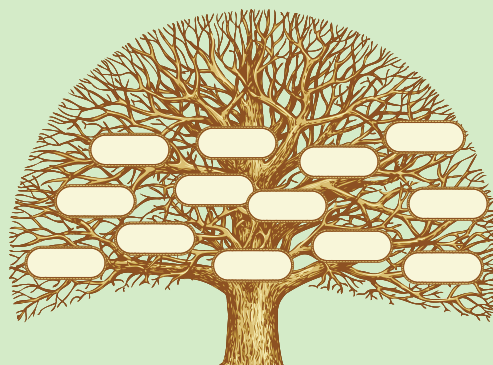


Family

Task: Family tree



Topic Overview

This topic should enable students to recognise and use some very basic phrases to talk about family.

Students will learn how to answer basic questions about their families using simple phrases and then make a fictional family tree.

This activity will allow students to understand the cultural differences between Ireland and Korea in regard to family, as well as to develop a further appreciation of cultural diversity.

Task Description

Students introduce their fictional families to each other

Learning Outcomes

- Ask and answer questions about families
- Understand cultural differences between Ireland and Korea in regard to family

Comments

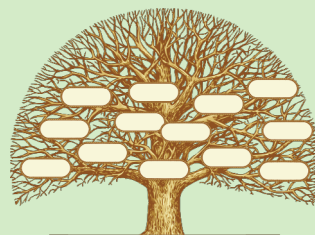
It may be more engaging for students if the teacher shows the video of the shark song before introducing vocabulary related to the topic of family.


It is also important to explain that there are different words used in relation to maternal families.

Teachers should remember to fully explain the word 'U-ri' related to the Korean community, as many students are typically confused by it.
