

Hangeul (The Korean alphabet)

Task: Writing your name

Topic Overview

This topic should enable students to understand the basic workings of the Hangeul writing system. Students will learn how to read consonants and vowels in Hangeul, as well as to understand how and by whom it was created. While writing their name in Korean, students may become curious about the Korean language and culture.

Task Description

Students write their name in Korean and practice calligraphy using a writing brush.

Learning Outcomes

- Write name in Korean
- Understand how to create a syllable
- Distinguish consonants and vowels in Hangeul

Comments

Instead of explaining the consonants and vowels of Hangeul, it would be better to read each sound.

Teachers must remember that it is important to properly explain how to form letters in Korean that start with a vowel. This is especially important in the context of first names, which often begin with a vowel. (' Anna -> 안나)

Teachers should also explain that students need to check how many syllables their name consists of and then match the Korean letters followin not letters but sound.

The teacher should explain how to compound a consonant and a vowel to make a syllable.

When a given word has the consonant 'o' in front of a vowel, the consonant is silent and only the vowel is pronounced.
