Topic 3 Phonetics

Topic Overview: This topic investigates phonetics as a branch of linguistics that studies how humans produce and perceive sounds.

Task 3.1 Description: Students learn about the places of articulation

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| Learning Intentions | Students will be more familiar with the places of articulation. |

| Task Outline | The teacher should open the phonetics slides to introduce the topic. Break the students into pairs to explore the places of articulation of consonants. Referring to the diagram, students must pronounce a list of words out loud, and fill in the worksheet. |

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Task 3.2 Description: Students work in phonetic symbols in pairs

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| Learning Intentions | <p>Students will be able to write their own name, school and county in phonetic symbols.</p> <p>Students will be able to read and write phonetic symbols.</p> |

| Task Outline | <p>Students are broken into pairs to use the phonetic symbols guide. Students must write their own name, school and county in phonetic symbols in their worksheet.</p> <p>Students have to write down 5 (short!) song titles or books of their choice using the phonetic symbols for their partner to decode.</p> <p>Look up five book titles from your home language or language class and write down their transcriptions.</p> <p>A more comprehensive International Phonetic Alphabet (IPA) is at https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/International_Phonetic_Alphabet.</p> <p>Irish language phonetic symbols are covered in detail at https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Help:IPA/Irish</p> |

Task 3.3 Description: The students will be given an articulation test puzzle

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| Learning Intentions | <p>Students will be able to apply what they have learnt to date about places of articulation (3.1) and phonetic symbols (3.2).</p> <p>Students will understand a real-life scenario where phonetics is used (speech therapy).</p> <p>Students will learn how to go about solving a phonetics puzzle.</p> |
