WHAT IS IT?

An instructional Playlist is a selection of carefully chosen activities which support personalised student learning of a particular skill or standard. Activities can be completed individually or collaboratively. It usually has mixed modalities, provides choice and is ideally supported through a Blended Learning model.

Suggested Elements

Screencasts	Students watch Screencast in advance of class and list any questions they have
Instructional Videos	Watch Instructional video and complete the online form summarising key learning points
Text	Students choose from a selection of texts eg article, speech, poem, menu, advertisement and complete activities based on targeted skill
Songs/ Podcasts	Listening activity on targeted skill such as a gap fill or spot the intruder using transcript
Skills Practice	Complete worksheet on the targeted skill
Self & Peer Assessment	Review a sample oral production on the targeted skill identify positives and possible improvements
Online Quizzes	Quizlet, Quizziz, Learning Apps etc
