Topic 4 Sociolinguistics

Topic Overview: In this topic students are introduced to sociolinguistics, which is concerned with the relationship between language and society. Students will have the opportunity to view language in the context of the world around them and apply what they have learned to an AILO puzzle of a pidgin language.

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Task Outline

Activity 4.1.1 Students highlight the words that they would most associate with this area of study.

Activity 4.1.2 and 4.1.3 Students match up common terms and definitions in Sociolinguistics Worksheet and complete the sentences with the appropriate term.

Activity 4.1.4 Using the question prompts, students discuss the use of register in language and then complete the crossword with the correct terminology.

Activity 4.1.5 Students identify the register in the speech bubbles

Activity 4.1.6 - Students recognise the use of formal and informal words for 'you' in other languages and complete the table. Students discuss the questions given on the topic.

Activity 4.1.7 - Students list words/phrases in English and another language (s) highlighting the formal and informal register

Task 4.2 Description: Students will explore the accents and dialects around us and consider the languages of Ireland and how some are endangered.

Learning Intentions

Students will discuss the role of accents

Students will identify different accents (native and non native English)

Students will recognise how there are different dialects of English

Students will identify common words across different dialects of English

Students will look at the languages of Ireland (Official and Minority)

Students will recall the origins of the Irish and English languages from the Historical Linguistics topic.

Students will consider the role of language in society and what happens if a language dies out or shifts to a dominant language

Task Outline	Give students this All Ireland Linguistics Olympiad (AILO) puzzle on Cameroonian Pidgin English (CPE) vocabulary items derived from English words. The students' task is to match the CPE compounds given for each word to their likely English translations.
