

### **Overview of the Research Funding**

Post-Primary Languages Ireland (PPLI) is a dedicated unit providing expertise and support for foreign languages education in Ireland. PPLI is fully funded by the Department of Education and Youth and was established in September 2000 with a remit of diversifying, enhancing and expanding the teaching of languages in post-primary schools throughout Ireland.

PPLI is opening a call for research proposals to support and inform the consultation and development of a follow-on strategy to <u>Languages Connect – Ireland's Strategy for Foreign Languages in Education 2017-2026</u>.

### Call for Proposals: Attitudes to Foreign Languages

The call for proposals is for a research project regarding the attitudes of third-level students towards foreign languages. Proposals are being sought which address each of the following questions:

- What motivates students' decision to participate or not participate in foreign language courses at third level?
- Which factors influence student motivation in relation to learning foreign languages?
- What are the potential barriers which prevent students from participating in foreign languages learning?
- What are the perceptions of students in relation to the role of foreign languages in their future careers or work opportunities

#### Key dates and figures

#### Call open:

- Application submission deadline: 14<sup>th</sup> November
- Notification of application outcomes: by 21<sup>st</sup> November
- Project completion deadline: 19<sup>th</sup> June 2026
- Funding of up to €15,000 is available\*

- \* Funding of up to €15,000 is available per project. Larger requests for funding for projects that are collaborative and include more than one Higher Education Institution will be considered.

#### Criteria for all proposals

Proposals will be evaluated by a review panel, with priority given to those that meet the following criteria:

- Address the themes
- Use appropriate methodological approaches and tools
- Provide evidence to suggest that outcomes are likely to lead to a better understanding of how languages should be presented and promoted to post-primary students and incoming students to the HEIs.

## **Eligibility**







The Principal Investigator must be based at a Higher Education Institution (HEI) in Ireland and hold a contract of sufficient duration to carry out the project.

# **Conditions of funding**

- Projects must be completed by 19<sup>th</sup> June 2026.
- A full report must be submitted on completion of the project.
- Interim reporting should be made to the Director of PPLI
- Financial support from PPLI should be acknowledged in any outputs from a grant under this scheme.
- HR advice from the principal investigator's own HEI must be sought before including personnel costs as part of a proposal.
